

**Brillion Youth Baseball Program  
Code of Conduct**

The Brillion Youth Baseball Program was established to promote the game of baseball and to provide an atmosphere in which the game can be learned and enjoyed. To this end the Brillion Community Center has created the following code of conduct. All players, coaches and parents of all Brillion baseball teams are required to abide by this code.

During team practices, players are expected to come prepared, to treat their team mates with respect, and to cooperate with their coaches. An unwillingness to cooperate will result in disciplinary action by coaches i.e. dismissing players from practice, requesting parental assistance for this player at practice, or further action by the Director of the Brillion Community Center. Coaches are expected to come prepared for practice, treat players and parents with respect, and to show fairness to all players.

During games, players are expected to conduct themselves in a sporting like manner at all times while participating in all league events. Opposing players and coaches, as well as referees, should be treated with respect. Coaches, including assistant coaches, are charged with the responsibility of controlling their players, parents, and themselves at all times during the game. All rules of the game are to be followed and the referee is the enforcer of these rules. The game may be ended at the discretion of the referee for disruptive behavior by players, parents, and coaches.

As parents, coaches and spectators you set an example for your children. Parents and spectators can be a very positive influence on the game of baseball and are encouraged to attend as many games as possible to support their children. Coaches, players and spectators who are disruptive and disrespectful to umpires, other parents, players or other coaches cannot be tolerated. It is the responsibility of the coaches/umpires to control disruptive parents. Keep in mind at all times that this recreational experience is for the children and not the adults.

If a parent has an issue about practice or a game we ask that his procedure be followed. A mandatory 48 hour cool down period be observed. After 48 hours you as a parent may speak to the coach in a calm manner about your concern we ask you keep an open mind. If you choose you may also contact the Recreation Director. We would like to hear any comments or questions so we may resolve the problems and continue to improve the program. Together we can enjoy the season and encourage our kids to be better athletes and more importantly better people. Remember when you attend an event you represent not only yourself but also Brillion.
